What is HB8?



Community Colleges are now funded on student outcomes

- Earning a **Credential of Value**
- Earning a Credential of Value in a **high-demand field**
- **Transferring to / Co-enrolling** in a GAI after earning **15 SCH**
- **Dual credit students earning 15 SCH**

Incentive weights for certain types of students

- **Economically disadvantaged**
- **Academically disadvantaged**
- **Students over 25**

FAST Funding

What is FAST funding?



Financial Aid for Swift Transfer (FAST) funding

- Allocation for participating colleges to cover tuition and fees for all **economically disadvantaged** students enrolled in dual credit courses that apply towards academic and workforce programs
- FAST incorporates a maximum **tuition rate** for dual credit students **set annually by the THECB**
 - FY2024 \$55.00 per SCH
 - FY2025 \$56.87 per SCH

What students are eligible?

Students who are...

- Enrolled in a public school district or charter school
- Taking eligible college courses offered through an institutional agreement
- **“Educationally disadvantaged”** – eligible to participate in national free or reduced-price lunch program (in last four years)

Program Benefits

- FAST-eligible students can incur no cost for dual credit coursework including tuition and fees, books, supplies, and other course materials

Limitations

- Neither the FAST-eligible student nor the school district may be charged **tuition** for the eligible student
- School districts and charter schools *may* be charged for **fees, books, supplies, or professional development** for FAST-eligible students


How is reimbursement calculated?

- Community Colleges must submit a roster of dual credit students.
 - Students must be identified by the **TSDS number**
 - SSNs ok in FY2024
- THECB/TEA confirms eligibility (not schools)
- The roster data is combined with the Student Schedule Report submitted by institutions to THECB to determine funding


